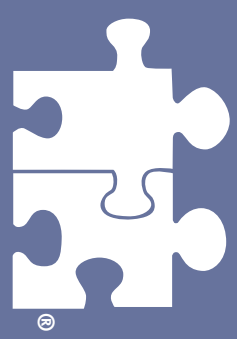

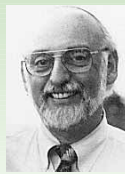

CMFCE is non-denominational, non-partisan, and non-sectarian and is supported solely by the proceeds of the annual conference. Presenters volunteer their time to the cause.



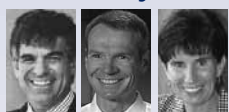
